Performance Notes

Unless otherwise indicated, glissandi should move all the way up the fingerboard. For double-stop glissandi, a single glissando line applies to both notes. The double-stop interval should be maintained throughout the glissando. Glissandi less than four beats in length should rise or fall exponentially. Glissandi four or more beats in length should rise or fall linearly.

All triple and quadruple stops should arpeggiate upwards.

Accidentals do *not* carry through the bar, but natural signs are nonetheless provided for confirmation and clarity. An exception to this rule applies from rehearsal Q to the end of the piece. Accidentals used for *col legno battuto ricochets* from rehearsal Q to the end of the piece hold for the duration of the bar, but only for those gestures.

With the exception of Rehearsal K, string numbers only apply to single notes.

Tempi should be followed as exactly as possible.

mst = *molto sul tasto* **st** = *sul tasto* **ord** = *ordinario* **sp** = *sul ponticello* **msp** = *molto sul ponticello*

mv = *molto vibrato* **nv** = *no vibrato*

arco = *bowing with hair* **pizz** = *pizzicato*

clb = *col legno battuto* **clt** = *col legno tratto*

→ = *Transition gradually between bow positions, vibrati, or hair to wood for the length indicated by the arrow.*
